Who Needs JUT?

Required for all Building Trades Journey Workers on Books 1 & 2 as per the Master Labor Agreement (MLA). Recently turned out Apprentices are required to complete training based on Journey Worker status as of September 1st of each year. August turn outs are required to begin JUT training the following month of the same year, September 1st.

What Is JUT?

Journeymen Upgrade Training (pronounced JUH-T) is a professional training benefit consistent with the requirements of the UA Standard for Excellence.

16 hours of approved training is required per Book 1 & 2 Journey Worker per JUT year.

Why Do I Need JUT?

JUT is an agreed upon working condition between Labor and Contractors in section 5.9 of the Master Labor Agreement (MLA). Consistent, documented, and professional training differentiates us from labor competitors. A well trained work force recaptures market share. Empowers DC16 Local Unions and Contractors to sustain a fair wage and benefits package.

When Is JUT Due?

The JUT year follows the Master Labor Agreement (MLA). The JUT year runs from September 1st to August 31st. 16 hours are due by August 31st of every JUT year. 8 rollover hours are allowed from the previous JUT year for training in excess of 16 hours.

JUT hours in excess of 8 will not* roll to the next JUT year.

*Excludes Mark Breslin on-line courses
